



Who is CACI?

CACI International Inc. is Virginia-based but operates an office in San Francisco (75 Hawthorne St., Suite 606). Ninety-two percent of its revenue comes from the federal government. CACI's original no-bid contract in Iraq was just extended by the Interior Department.

Role in Abu Ghraib: CACI employees were hired to work as interrogators and in other forms of "counter intelligence." This contract landed at least 27 CACI employees in Iraq's Abu Ghraib prison working as interrogators. One of CACI's interrogators, Steven A. Stefanowicz, "allowed and/or instructed MPs, who are not trained in interrogation techniques, to facilitate interrogations by 'setting conditions' which were neither authorized and in accordance with applicable regulations/policy. He clearly knew his instructions equated to physical abuse." *Army Major General Antonio Taguba's Report (February, 2004)*

General Taguba recommended that Mr. Stefanowicz be reprimanded, fired and stripped of his security clearance. Over a year since the Abu Ghraib scandal no CACI employees known to have committed torture have been brought up on any charges.

IS TORTURE just another technology?

CACI Faces Legal Action: A class action lawsuit was filed on June 4, 2004 against Titan Corporation of San Diego and CACI by detainees and victims of torture in Abu Ghraib. The plaintiffs seek damages under the Alien Tort Claims Act and name CACI and Titan as an organized conspiracy under the RICO statute.

Continuing Risk: CACI and Titan continue to jointly recruit interrogators to work in U.S. military facilities in Iraq, Afghanistan and/or Kosovo ("must be a trained counterintelligence agent or interrogator"; "Knowledge of the Arabic language and culture a plus").

Profiting from torture: Meanwhile, CACI's original contract worth around

\$45 million was extended in August 2004 for an additional \$23 million. Last year was a year of record financial performance for the CACI. 2004 was their first year with over \$1 billion in revenues and profits soared 42% to a record \$64 million (*CACI International Inc. 2004 Annual Report*).

Today, May 16th, CACI's vice president and other top executives will be in town to present at an investors' conference at the Westin St. Francis Hotel. Help us confront CACI's directors and clients about their involvement in torture and launch a campaign to shut down CACI's San Francisco office.
