

# AFSCME MEMBERS PRESENT TOP UC EXECUTIVES WITH EMPTY PLATES

On Tuesday, November 20<sup>th</sup>, in honor of Thanksgiving, hundreds of UC workers marched on top UC Leaders across the state demanding that they:

***“Prioritize frontline workers, not top executives.”***

- UC is considering even more increases for top executives—starting with a 5% increase for some executives who already get huge salaries and **up to 16% increases for other executives.**
- Meanwhile, thousands of us who are frontline patient care and student service providers **are living on the edge and cannot make ends meet on the low salaries UC pays.**
- UC’s low wages, outdated pay system and refusal to guarantee low cost benefits makes providing quality care difficult. **Many of us are forced to work short staffed and come in sick or exhausted because our department cannot recruit & retain enough staff for proper coverage.**
- UC has the money to bring us up to the market standards and provide guaranteed wages & benefits that allow us to support ourselves and our families. **In 2006, net income after expenses for the five UC Medical Centers was \$371.8 Million!**



**We demand to be treated like other hospital and community college workers. We must keep the pressure on!**
