

The revolutionary crucible of Latin American politics gave birth to a form of radical
cultural resistance called Theater of the Oppressed (TO), now practiced worldwide by
millions of educators, artists, organizers, and activists.

Based on Paulo Freire's Pedagogy of the Oppressed, TO is a collection of games, techniques and exercises for using theater and art as a vehicle for personal and political transformation. It uses the dynamized human body and the charged theatrical space as a laboratories for exploring power, transforming oppression, and finding collective solutions to the fundamental problems of conflict, inequality, injustice and human suffering. Kairos Theater Ensemble will present an overview of the history, theory of TO, and share tools for dialogue, community building, solidarity and critical thinking. This workshop should be useful for activists, organizers, educators, cultural workers, and anyone else interested in transforming relations of power through creativity and critical intelligence while reclaiming our fundamental sociality and relatedness.
